

Every October, during National Red Ribbon Week from the 23rd to the 31st, we pause to remember the remarkable D.E.A. Agent Enrique "Kiki" Camarena. His undying spirit and commitment energize our ongoing endeavors against drug misuse. The ever-burning torch, a tribute to Kiki, illuminates our mission, leading us toward a drug-free tomorrow for our young ones. Our motto, "Never Forget Kiki," emphasizes his enduring influence and our united dedication.

Educational Foundation, the Seymore D'Fair Foundation is excited to introduce the new Kiki's Red Ribbon School Celebration 2023, specially designed for students in grades K-6. To date, over 8000 elementary and middle school students have participated in Kiki and Seymore's program.

### Theme: "I'm Better Drug-Free!"

Our 2023 theme, "I'm Better Drug-Free!" underscores the individual student's journey of self-realization, emphasizing self-worth, the power of personal choices, and the countless possibilities a drug-free life offers. It beckons students to acknowledge their true potential and embrace the endless opportunities of living without drugs.

### **Program Highlights:**

Devised by a team of adept early childhood educators, our program effortlessly integrates seamlessly into any daily curriculum. Each grade-level specific package offers the following:

- Teachers' instructional guides
- Clearly delineated daily lesson plans

- Key vocabulary sections
- Engaging activity worksheets
- Constructive student feedback tools and assessments

Anchored in the social-emotional learning (S.E.L.) paradigm, this research-based curriculum consists of five 50-minute daily lessons. These sessions are meticulously crafted to endow students with knowledge and vital life skills, fostering resilience, empathy, and profound self-awareness.

### ESTABLISH GRADE-LEVEL RED RIBBON WEEK TEAM AND VOLUNTEERS.

It's recommended to have two teachers per grade level to facilitate various activities such as:

- Distributing student activity materials.
- Creating hallway bulletin boards featuring daily activities.
- Organizing a school-wide assembly to conclude the program.
- Adding vibrant decorations to the school for Red Ribbon Week.

Facilitate seamless coordination by emailing teachers and staff members, ensuring they are well informed about the schedule and where to access the comprehensive five-day activity package and plan.

### SECTION 3. DAILY ACTIVITIES AND CURRICULUM GUIDES

The Kiki's Red Ribbon School Celebration Program is a 5-day drug awareness and prevention initiative that fosters school and community engagement throughout Louisiana and the United States. Since its launch in 2018, more than eight thousand students in elementary and middle schools have received classroom instruction during the beta test and pilot program.

**Community Involvement:** Every October, the Kiki's Red Ribbon School Celebration program is offered to any elementary or middle school (grades K-6) at absolutely no cost. Developed by Seymore's Education Team, this program equips schools with a structured microcurriculum that aligns with Louisiana and national curriculum standards. Seymore's Foundation supplies each school with a comprehensive, S.E.L.-based 5-day drug prevention activity package, which includes all teaching materials, lesson plans, daily activity sheets, preand post-assessments for students, and teacher guides.

**Kiki Camarena and the History of Red Ribbon Week:** The Red Ribbon Campaign® pays tribute to Kiki Camarena, a D.E.A. Special Agent who tragically lost his life in 1985 after being abducted by drug gangs in Mexico. The annual mission of the Red Ribbon School Celebration is to unite communities visibly and demonstrate their commitment to building a DRUG-FREE AMERICA.

### **Daily Activity & Curriculum Guide**

Day 3 | Seymore Talks: "Can't Stop the Feeling" of Being Drug-Free. **DRUG HEALTH EDUCATION DAY** 

•50-minute Classroom Session introducing the basic premise of Medicines and Drugs using a fact sheet on Good and Bad Medicines and Drugs (Grade level specific).

### OBJECTIVES | Grade K-1:

Students will help create a list of good and bad medicines and drugs. The students will read and discuss Seymore's Medicine & Drug Fact Sheet.

Students will identify which drugs are good and bad through discussion.

Students will sort pictures and objects to create a Good and Bad Medicines and Drugs chart. Students will discuss and complete Seymore Says Is it Healthy or Hurtful Activity. Students will participate in Can't Stop the Feeling and Drug Free Songs. Students will summarize lessons through the Day 3 Assessment.

### **ACTIVITIES**

- The teacher will create a list of good and bad medicines and drugs through class discussion from student responses to questions.
- Teachers and students will read and discuss the Medicine & Drug Fact Sheet and compare it to student responses.

### **Honoring those Committed to Drug-Free Lifestyles**

### OBJECTIVES

The students will understand the meaning behind Kiki's Red Ribbon School Celebration.

Students will summarize information about Kiki, Seymore, and Red Ribbon School Celebration through PowerPoint presentations.

Students will complete a verbal questioning assessment. Students will view, read, and identify vocabulary words. (These words will be used during the week.) Students will read, recite, and sign the Drug-Free Pledge. Students will construct a paper image representing themselves for weeklong activities. Students will listen to, sing, dance, and appreciate the songs for the week. Students will summarize lessons through the Day 1 Assessment.

### **ACTIVITIES**

The students will listen to the legacy and mission of Kiki and Seymore through PowerPoint presentations and complete verbal questioning assessments. Given a list of vocabulary words used during the week, students will view, read, and identifythe words and definitions.

- Students will read, recite, and sign Louisiana's Drug-Free Pledge.
- Students will take part in building, creating, and designing a paper image of themselves to go along with the lessons for the week.
- Students will listen to and learn songs about the program topic and theme.

- 2. The teacher will state the objectives for Day 3.
- 3. Using chart paper, the teacher will create a list of good and bad medicines and drugs from student responses to questions. What are the names of some good and bad treatments and medicines?
- Using Seymore's Medicine & Drug Fact Sheet, the teacher and students will read, discuss, and compare the sheet to student responses.
- 5. Students will participate in a team-building exercise assessing their knowledge by sorting medicine boxes, pictures, and vocabulary cards

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### Day 1 | Instructional Procedures

### Lesson Plan

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- The teacher begins the lesson with music for Day 1 Drug-Free Mel.

- 3. The teacher will show PowerPoint presentations on Kiki and Seymore
- . Using the verbal questioning assessment in the PowerPoint presentation, the teacher and students will complete the turn-and-talk activity as a class.
- Using the Vocabulary Terms sheet, the teacher will lead a discussion on the vocabulary words students will be introduced to and use during the week.
- Depending on grade level, the teacher can incorporate a vocabulary lesson using the vocabulary terms.
- 7. The teacher will instruct students on reading and identifying the words and definitions.
- The teacher will instruct students on which vocabulary activity sheet would apply for grade-level use. (Pages provided in Day 1 packet)
- 9. Modification Met My Match!
- Grades K-1 teacher may introduce (5) five words a day. Write the words and definitions on chart paper. Challenge students to learn meanings. After all words are introduced, play a class game. Using the word cards and definition cards provided in the packet, cut apart and pass out word cards and definition cards randomly around the room. Have students walk around the room and find the matching person. When students find a match, say, "Met My Match!" (Word to definition card). Check as a class when complete.
- 10. The teacher will display and read the Drug-Free Pledge with students.
- 11. The teacher will allow students time to sign individual drug-free pledges
- 12. Body construction: Using the teacher direction page, the teacher will display or read directions for constructing a picture representation of themselves.
- 13. Students will be given the materials to build, create, and design facial, hair, and shoe feature replicas.
- $14. \, \mbox{The Teacher will pass out name tag templates to attach to project.}$
- 15. The teacher will play songs related to the day's topic and weekly theme. This activity can be used during the construction of the body.


## Day 2 | Instructional Procedures Lesson Plan | Page 1

- 1. The Teacher begins the lesson with the music for Day 2 | Brave Song: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=QUQsqBqxoR4
- 2. The Teacher will state the objectives for Day 2.
- 3. If you are in grades K-1, introduce and discuss five more vocabulary words and meanings.
- Grades 2-3: Read and Review vocabulary words and meanings
- 5. The Teacher will ask the students to define the term unique.
- The students will identify different meanings using "unique." The Teacher will create a list and discuss student responses using the chart paper and a marker.
- 7. Students listen to the story: I Am Me!



- 8. After listening to the story, the Teacher and student will discuss the story's purpose.
- Teachers may use the Teacher Information Packet on positive character traits and unique qualities to guide class discussion and provide younger students an in-depth look at understanding themselves and the qualities of being unique.
- 10. Give students time to reflect, work in groups, or share from various resources like the message from the story, vocabulary terms, list of virtues, positive character traits, Questions to Ask Yourself, sheet, and peer feedback to brainstorm unique qualities about themselves. (This can lead into a good classroom discussion)
- 11. The Teacher will hand out "I Am Unique Cards". These cards are part of Day 4 writing activity. (I Am Unique cards provided in Day 2 Packet)
- 12. The students will write these unique qualities about themselves on "I Am Unique" cards. Activities 11-13 can be completed throughout the rest of the week.
- 13. The students will use magazines to cut out pictures, words, and sayings to identify unique qualities about themselves.



### Kiki Camarena and Red Ribbon Week History

Enrique "Kiki" Camarena Salazar, a dedicated intelligence officer with the United States Drug Enforcement Administration (D.E.A.), tragically met his fate in February 1985. He was kidnapped by drug traffickers acting on behalf of Mexican politicians in Guadalajara, Mexico, and subjected to horrific



torture before being brutally murdered. While three leaders of the Guadalajara drug cartel were eventually convicted for their roles in Camarena's death in Mexico, the ripple effect of this tragedy reached far beyond borders. The U.S. launched ten additional trials in Los Angeles, prosecuting other Mexican nationals connected to the case. This ongoing saga has periodically strained U.S.—Mexican relations, most notably with the controversial release of Rafael Caro Quintero, one of the three convicted traffickers, from a Mexican prison in 2013. However, the Mexican Forces successfully recaptured Caro Quintero in July 2022.

Out of this heartbreaking loss emerged Red Ribbon Week, an annual awareness campaign in the United States. Commencing every October, it spotlights alcohol, tobacco, drug, and violence prevention. Originating in 1985, Red Ribbon Week is a tribute to the memory of the fallen D.E.A. special agent Enrique Camarena. Recognized by the United States D.E.A., it stands as the nation's largest and longest-running drug awareness and prevention program, honoring individuals like Kiki Camarena, who made the ultimate sacrifice in the fight against drugs and violence.

### Seymore D'Fair Foundation 100% Me Drug-Free Specialty License Plates

Beginning in the fall of 2019, Louisiana vehicle owners could purchase Seymore's "Louisiana is Better with ME 100% Drug-Free!" specialty license plate. This effort helps Louisiana's children by promoting a drug-free life.

When vehicle owners buy a "Louisiana is Better with ME 100% Drug-Free!" plate, proceeds from each purchase are dedicated to supporting drug awareness, education, and prevention programs for elementary and middle schools that promote drug-free

Available in 2023, Seymore Says, "Don't Be a Bird Brain" Avoid Drugs! Utilizing the advances of medical research and scientific studies, the Seymore Says "Don't Be a Bird Brain" program was designed and developed by professional educators, applying effective educational strategies supported by evidence and research. The program was created specifically for elementary and middle schools.

The program is designed to introduce the concept of helpful medicines, harmful and dangerous drugs, avoidance encouragement, and first-use prevention or discouragement.



# **ADDITIONAL PROGRAMS**

This drug education program has four teaching units across the visual arts, science, language arts, and health curricula. Each unit is broken into subsections for appropriate grade-level content, and the grade-level progressions are 1-2, 3-4, and 5-6.

The modular design allows schools to substitute existing art, science, reading, and health units with Seymore's teaching units to deliver drug prevention instruction seamlessly within the current curriculum infrastructure without disruption.

### **Program Messaging and P.T.A. Support**

School-parent organizations and P.T.A.s can purchase and display campaign materials with the "Louisiana Is Better with ME 100% Drug-Free!" logo and slogan to reinforce the drug awareness and prevention celebration. Proceeds from selling drug-free-themed merchandise will help support schools' continuing drug prevention efforts and promote the drug-free message year-round. ### Drug Prevention Education Requirements – Louisiana Law

Seymore's Foundation's educational programs have been meticulously designed to support Louisiana school districts in fulfilling their obligations under Louisiana Revised Statutes 17:154 and 17:404. These statutes legally mandate that each state elementary and middle school deliver annual drug prevention instruction tailored to each student's grade level (Louisiana Revised Statutes 17:154 and 17:404).
